

ORDINANCE NO. 174

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF COKEBURG
REGULATING VEHICULAR USE OF STREETS
AND SIDEWALKS OF THE BOROUGH OF COKEBURG

SECTION 1. ADOPTION OF REGULATIONS, SIGNS AND SIGNAGE.

- A. The Council of the Borough of Cokeburg shall have the power, by ordinance, to designate and establish stop intersections on any or all streets and highways, to designate any and all streets and highways as one-way streets and highways, to regulate the use of all streets and highways, and to regulate the speed limit on all streets and highways, within the Borough of Cokeburg.
- B. The Streets Committee, or any other committee designated by Borough Council, is hereby authorized to procure and place any signs and notices as may be necessary to enforce the provisions of this chapter.
- C. The definitions contained in the Pennsylvania "Vehicle Code" shall apply to this Ordinance.
- D. All traffic zones, including "NO PARKING" zones, regulated speed zones, one-way streets, and stop intersections shall be designated by signs which shall correspond in general with State highway signs. "NO PARKING" zones may be designated by painted curbs.

SECTION 2. OPERATION OF VEHICLES ON SIDEWALKS.

It shall be unlawful to operate any motor vehicle or motorcycle on or upon any sidewalk within the Borough of Cokeburg.

SECTION 3. SPEED LIMIT

It shall be unlawful for any vehicle to be operated on the streets and highways of the Borough of Cokeburg at a rate of speed in excess of twenty (20) miles per hour, unless otherwise posted.

SECTION 4. PARKING RESTRICTIONS.

Notwithstanding any other provision of this Ordinance to the contrary, no motor vehicle of any kind shall be permitted to park at any time in the Borough of Cokeburg as follows:

- A. In a zone designated by the Borough Council, or its designee, as a handicapped zone; unless the vehicle parked in the handicapped zone is a vehicle authorized to be parked in that handicapped parking zone by a permit for handicapped parking, issued by the Borough Council or its designee, for that particular handicapped parking zone. Any handicapped designation issued by the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation shall be considered as having been issued by the Borough Council.
- B. In front of a firehouse door or entrance.
- C. Within fifteen (15) feet of any intersecting street.
- D. More than six (6) inches from the curb.
- E. At an improper angle.
- F. In a posted no-parking zone.
- G. In a manner that obstructs a crosswalk or sidewalk.
- H. In front of a private driveway.
- I. In a manner that constitutes double parking.
- J. On the sidewalk or curb.
- K. Within fifteen (15) feet of a fire hydrant.
- L. In a manner that obstructs or blocks vehicular or pedestrian traffic.

SECTION 5. VEHICLE WEIGHT LIMITS AND THRU VEHICLE ROUTE.

No vehicle having a weight, loaded or unloaded, of more than five (5) tons (ten thousand (10,000) pounds) shall enter upon or travel upon any street or highway of the Borough of Cokeburg, except for (1) delivery or pick-up, (2) construction activity within the Borough, or, (3) travel by residents to or from their residence; other than upon the following "Thru Vehicle Route":

- A. Upon entering the Borough at the intersection of Route 917 and Washington Street, said vehicle shall proceed along Washington Street to Grant

Street to Madison Street to Washington Street,
exiting the Borough on Washington Street.

- B. Upon entering the Borough along Washington Street Extension (i.e. from Ontario), said vehicle shall proceed along Washington Street to Grant Street to Madison Street to Washington Street, exiting the Borough on Washington Street.

It is forbidden for any vehicle, having a weight, loaded or unloaded, of more than five (5) tons (ten thousand (10,000.00 pounds), which is traveling through said Borough to a destination outside the Borough, to travel upon and street or highway in the Borough except insofar as set forth above.

SECTION 6. ONE-WAY STREETS.

The following borough streets are to be one-way and all vehicular traffic is permitted to proceed only in the direction indicated.

SECTION 7. LIABILITY OF EMPLOYER.

For the purposes of this chapter, when a commercial vehicle is being operated in violation of any of the provisions of this chapter, the employer of the person operating the motor vehicle shall be in violation of this chapter in addition to his, her or its employee.

SECTION 8. PARKING PROHIBITED AT ALL TIMES.

No person shall park a vehicle at any time upon any streets or parts thereof, except as follows:

- A. On the northeast side of Washington Street, from house No. 1 to house No. 15
- B. On the west side of Adams Street, from house No. 10 to house No. 38.
- C. On the east side of Nixon Street, from house No. 104 to house No. 128.

SECTION 9. SPECIAL PURPOSE PARKING EXCEPTIONS.

Parking shall be limited to the following special purposes and in the following locations.

Loading and unloading	all streets
Deliveries and pick-ups	all streets
Construction work	all streets
Medical personnel	all streets
Special events	all streets
Holidays	all streets

SECTION 10. VIOLATIONS AND PENALTIES.

- A. Any person violating any part of this ordinance, with the exception of Section 4J, shall, upon conviction, pay a fine of \$15.00, as well as the cost of prosecution.
- B. Any person violating Section 4J of this Ordinance, shall, upon conviction, pay a fine of \$50.00, as well as the cost of prosecution.
- C. Any person who willfully defaults in payment of any fine or costs shall be committed to the County Correctional Facility for a number of days equal to one (1) day for each \$15.00 of the unpaid balance of the fine and costs.
- D. Upon plea and proof that a person is unable to pay any fine and costs imposed under this section, a court may order payment of the fine and costs in installments and shall fix the amounts, times and manner of payment.
- E. Any person who does not comply with an installment payment order entered under this section shall be committed to the County Correctional Facility for a number of days equal to one (1) day for each \$40.00 of the unpaid balance of the fine and costs.

SECTION 11. CONFLICTING ORDINANCES REPEALED.

That any ordinance, or part of any ordinance, conflicting with this ordinance be and the same is hereby repealed. Specifically repealed hereby are Ordinances 19, 38, 45, 54, 55, 65, 73, 82, 126, and, 139.

SECTION 12: EFFECTIVE DATE.

This ordinance shall become effective on date of enactment.
