ORDINANCE No. 97 ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF COKEBURG, WASHINGTON COUNTY, COMMONWEALTH FOR THE PREVENTION AND CONTROL OF AIR POLLUTION, FOR TERMS USED HEREIN, PROVIDING FOR ENFORCEMENT, EXCEP-TONS AND PENALTIES. SECTION I pitle dinance shall be known and may be cited as the Cokeburg Borough his ordinance of 1970. Policy the Council of the Cokeburg Borough has determined that air whereas from an open fire may be detrimental to the books. Whereas the total open fire may be detrimental to the health, comfort, pollutions, welfare and safety of the citizens of Colors pollution from the health, comfort, conditions, welfare and safety of the citizens of Cokeburg, it living conditions, to be the policy of the Borough of Cokeburg to is hereby declared to be the policy of the Borough of Cokeburg to is hereby the citizens of said borough from such air pollution. SECTION III Definitions The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this ordinance, mless the context clearly indicates otherwise, shall have the following meanings ascribed to them: (1) PERSON -- Any individual, partnership, association, syndicate, company, firm, trust, corporation, department, bureau, agency or other entity recognized by law as the subject of rights and duties.

(2) COUNCIL—Borough Council of Cokeburg. (3) GARBAGE -- All putrescrible animal and vegetable matter resulting from the handling, Prepar on, cooking and sonsumption of food. from the handling, Prepare to the cooking and sonsumption of lood.

(4) RUBBISH--Solids not consisted to be highly flammable or explosive, including, but not limite to rags, old clothes, leather, carpets, wood excelsior, paper, access, tree branches, tree leaves, yard trimmings, furniture, the cans, glass, crockery, masonry and other similar materials. (5) TRADE WASTE--All solid or liquid material or bubbish resulting from construction, building operations, and the prosecution of any business, trade of industry including, but not limited to plastic products, cartons, paint, gre in oil and other petroleum products, chemicals, rubber of synthetic rubber or plastics, cinders and other forms of social and lamid waste materials. cinders and other forms of solid or liquid waste materials, provided, however, that trade waste shall not include any coal refuse associated with the mining or preparation of coal. REFUSE -- Garbage, rubbish and trade waste. (7) SALVAGE OPERATION -- Any business, trade or industry engaged in whole or in part in salvaging or reclaiming any product or material, including including, but not limited to, metals, chemicals, shipping containers (8) OPEN FIRE -- A fire in which any material is burned in the open or in a recommendation. in a receptacle other than a furnace or incinerator. (9) FURNACE -- Any enclosed device specifically designed for the burning of any material for the production of heat.

(10) INCINERATOR—Any device specifically designed for the destruction by burning of any material for the production of heat. by burning of refuse, sewage sludge or any other combustible material. SECTION IV The Borough of Cokeburg Chief of Police or any other duly authorized agent have the por authorized agent by the Borough Council shall have the power and duty to enforce the Inforcement duty to enforce the provisions of this ordinance.

SECTION V Regulations

After October 1st., 1970, no person shall:

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(1) Ignite of feed an open fire for the destruction of refuse or in the conduct of a salvage operation in any public or private in the conduct of a salvage operation. in the conduct of a salvage of private place outside of any building, or place outside of any building, the maintenance of any open fire Cause, suffer, allow or permit the conduct of a salvage for the destruction of refuse or in the conduct of a salvage for the destruction of refuse of an salva operation on any property under his control outside of any building.

(1) Open fires may be set in the performance of an official duty of Open fires may be set in the fire is necessary for: any public officer, if the fire is necessary for: (a) The prevention of a fire hazard which cannot be abated by other means. The protection of public health. (b) The protection of parameter training programs.

(c) Official Fire Department training programs.

Open fires may be set with the approval of the authorized enforcement agents of this ordinance provided: (a) Rubbish only is burned; and There is no practical available alternate method for the disposal of the material to be burned, and No hazardous or other objectionable condition will be created by such burning.

(3) Open fires may be set on any day, Tuesday through Saturday, between the hours of 5:00 P.M. to 7:00 P.M. for the burning or rubbish only and the fire must be extinguished at 7:00 P.M. SECTION VI Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall upon the conviction thereof by any justice of the peace, alderman or magistrate, be sentenced to pay a fine of not less than twenty-five (\$25:00) dollars nor more than one hundred(\$100.00) dollars, together with the costs, for the first violation, and not less than fifty (\$50.00) dollars nor more than two hundred (\$200.00) dollars, together with the costs, for the second and subsequent violations. Each day a violation exists shall constitute a separate offense. In default in the payment of any fine, the defendant shall be sentenced to jail for a period not exceeding thirty (30) days. SECTION VII The provisions of this ordinance are severable, and if any section, clause, sentence, part or provision thereof shall be held illegal, invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competut jurisdiction, such decision of the cout shall not affect or in the remaining this ordinance. sections, clauses, sentences, parts or provision. It is hereby declared to be the intent of the Borough Council that this ordinance would not have been adopted if such illegal, invalid or unconstitutional section, clause, sentence, part or provision had not been included herein. SECTION VIII
